3) [Scope
3) [This Joint Intelligence Bulletin (JIB) is intended to provide an overview of violent threats against Jewish communities in the Homeland in the aftermath of recent attacks and disrupted plots. The FBI, DHS, and NCTC advise federal, state, local, tribal, and territorial government counterterrorism and law enforcement officials and private sector security partneresponsible for securing Jewish communities to remain vigilant in light of the enduring threat to Jewish communities posed by domestic violent extremists (DVEs) and perpetrators of hate crimes. This JIB is provided to assist federal, state, local, tribal, and territorial counterterrorist and law enforcement officials and private sector security partners in effectively deterring, preventing, preempting, or responding to hate crime incidents and terrorist attacks in the United States.

	(b)(3) The FBI and DHS define a domestic violent extremist (DVE) as an individual based and operating entirely within the United States or its territories without direction or inspiration from a foreign terrorist group or other foreign power who seeks to further political or social goals wholly or in part through unlawful acts of force o violence.

On 21 May, the individual was indicted on numerous federal and state charges, including federal hate crime charges, and is currently awaiting trial.
